Both David and Jean continue to work tirelessly for Aston, often quietly and unassumingly behind the scenes. Editing *The ACORN* is not an easy job, yet every quarter for 21 years the magazine appeared, beautifully crafted as if by magic.

## **Aston on Trent History Group**

#### Friends of Aston Brickyard (FAB)

In October we celebrated our 10th year as the FAB Volunteer Team and it's the first time we've referred to our Local Nature Reserve (LNR) as 'distressing'. The summer heatwave and drought conditions have taken their toll on the site. Fallen, dead and dying trees, dropping pond levels and a seeming reduction in wildlife have impacted considerably. We pumped in an extra two thousand litres into the pond, which helped to a certain extent. The rigid, hornwort oxygenating plants have covered the pond, which reduced the evaporation and kept the water clarity high. Aquatics seem to have weathered the conditions and if you're patient you will still see an abundance of newts, diving beetles, whirligigs and other insect life.

Ash dieback has increased and DCC Rangers will be on site over the autumn and winter months to fell any dangerous trees. The wildflower meadow was put on stand-by due to the drought, so time will tell if our plants have survived. Unfortunately, most of the fifty-plus new saplings all suffered from lack of water, but they will be replaced next month with free trees, courtesy of the national I-DiG initiative. ## Neighbourhood Watch



**AGM and Committee:** We will hold our AGM later in the year. We are in need of new committee members to enable *The Watch* to continue. In particular, we are in need of a Chair. *The Watch* has always been strong in the village, but needs some fresh faces to ensure viability in the long-term. **Membership:** The membership is always open. The formal renewal process runs every 2 years and your ongoing support is appreciated. Thanks to all co-ordinators, who put in their time to ensure the process works well. We continue to be the largest membership group in the village, with around 70% of households registered. Our communication method means we can distribute safety messages accurately and promptly to residents. If you are not a member and would like to be, please contact us and we will put you in touch with your local co-ordinator.

**Co-ordinators:** We desperately need coordinators for *Mulberry Way* and *Shirley Park*. The role is not onerous. **Could you help?** You would need to pass on messages to your neighbours, most easily done via email or via a secure group and collect subscriptions every 2 years. Residents will become vulnerable without someone coming forward. If you are interested in becoming more involved as a co-ordinator elsewhere, that would also be welcome, as some existing co-ordinators have large areas or are supporting households away from their own close neighbours.

Messaging and Communication: Messages coming in to our communication officer are checked regularly. Please remember that only crime or incident details that come from the Police, the victim or your co-ordinator will be circulated to members. Whilst we do keep an eye on social media, we will not take what's written there as permission to circulate to members. Experience has taught us that unfortunately we cannot always rely on all that we see. We are also signed up to the *Neighbourhood Alert System*, which ensures all official messages can be passed to members where appropriate.

**IMPORTANT UPDATE:** As we go into autumn and the nights get darker, opportunities rise for those who want to commit crimes. There are a few things you can do to improve safety for your vehicles and outbuildings:

- 1. Check security lights are working and clean. Where appropriate, consider installing localised CCTV
- 2. Check garages and shed locks and make sure they are secure
- 3. Don't leave valuables in vehicles
- 4. When leaving your vehicle, even for a short time, lock it behind you
- 5. If you are out and about please consider the use of some high visibility clothing, particularly for the more vulnerable and those out running. Torches and lights are useful to carry and all cyclists need to check their visibility before embarking on any journey.

**Scams on the increase:** Please be aware that scams relating to energy rebates are on the increase. Please check authenticity and don't provide banking details to ANYONE over the phone. ALWAYS contact your energy supplier if you are in any doubt. If you are a victim of a crime, please don't forget to report the incident to your co-ordinator.
