

The Council's current term of office ends on 9th May 2023, following the local elections (4 May 2023). At that point, a new term of office begins for the refreshed Committee. The Parish Council would like to thank all of our elected and co-opted councillors who have served over the last four years, and have seen a number of projects to fruition, including improved parish infrastructure, celebratory events, and support for local interest groups.

Annual Parish Meeting & Excellence in the Community Award: Cllr. Hicklin chaired the meeting with a comprehensive list of gratitude to many members of the community for their hard work and input over the last 12 months. This popular event covered reports and updates from many village groups, as well as the District and County Council. Cllr. Hicklin hosted the annual Excellence in the Community Award and announced the nominees. Our Panel's short-list included Debbie Hoddinott, Chairperson of the War Memorial Hall Committee and Treasurer for several village organisations, Mary Day, Parochial Church Council for outstanding efforts maintaining the Books in the Belfry, Lindsay Pilkington, Chairperson of Recreation in Aston and Richard Coates & Carole Bagnall of Aston on Trent's Local History Group. Well done to all! Richard Coates & Carole Bagnall were confirmed as the award winners by the selection panel. They received congratulations from everyone and were presented with a Certificate of Achievement. Their names have been added to the Honours Board situated in The War Memorial Hall.

Alvaston Medical Centre (inc Aston On Trent Branch): The recruitment drive continues to bring staff levels to budget, with information posted on social media and in local public buildings. Cllr. Mike Selby was re-elected as Chairman, Hadyn Wheeler, Vice Chairman and Alicia Mitchell, Secretary of the *Patient's Participation Group* for the next year.

Helping Aston Stay Safe

AGM and Committee: We will hold our AGM later in the year. We continue to need new committee members to enable *the Watch* to continue. Particularly we need a Chair. The Watch has always been strong in the Village but needs some fresh faces to ensure viability in the long term. Anyone interested can ring Tony on 792114. Unfortunately this is a repeated request, but necessary.

Membership: Our membership is always open. The formal renewal process runs every 2 years and your ongoing support is appreciated. Thanks to all the co-ordinators, who put in their time to ensure the process works well. If you are not a member and would like to be, please contact us and we will put you in touch with your local co-ordinator.

Co-ordinators: We desperately need co-ordinators for Mulberry Way, Shirley Park and Derby Road (Derby end). The role is not onerous. Could you help? You would need to pass on our messages to your neighbours, most easily done via email via a secure group and collect subscription every 2 years. If you are interested in becoming more involved as a co-ordinator elsewhere that would also be welcome as some existing co-ordinators have large areas or are supporting households away from their own close neighbours.

Messaging and Communication: Messages coming in to our communication officer are checked regularly. Please remember that only crime or incident details passed to members that come from the police, the victim or your co-ordinator will be circulated. Whilst we do keep an eye on social media, we will not take what's written as permission to circulate to members. We are signed up to all the Alerts from the police. However, it's often the case we don't get told because people see it on social media and think we are aware when maybe we aren't?

Burglary Update: Unfortunately in March we had a dwelling Burglary in the village. These are traumatic events and thankfully rare for our village. It reminds us all that we never really know who may be out and about, searching out our vulnerabilities. If someone looks out of place or suspicious please be prepared to report what makes you feel uncomfortable. If you have alarms and CCTV it is sensible to check them and have them properly serviced, they may come in handy.

Scams on the increase: Please be aware that scams are a real threat and come in many guises. Please check authenticity of anyone you don't know and never provide banking details to unknown sources. If you are in any doubt about a caller, visitor or emails please seek out a family member, neighbour or friend. If it does not feel right, simply, it won't be. If you have vulnerable family members please have a chat with them about how to deal with people they don't know. Allow them to be confident they can call someone without feeling *silly*. Our crime and anti-social behaviour issues remain low, we live in a safe place and working together we can keep it that way. Please keep us informed.

If you are a victim of crime don't forget to report the incident to your co-ordinator. Emergency calls 999 and non-urgent calls 101 (101 calls are now free)
