Parish Council (PC): The PC wishes to thank Bill Fereday for his contribution and achievements in and around the Parish throughout his tenure. The PC welcomed Stephen Gill to the team earlier in Q1 2024.

### Annual Parish Meeting (APM) and our Excellence in the Community (EitC) Award 2024:

This popular event proved to be a hit once again, with many community groups represented, acknowledged and thanked for their hard work and achievements over the last 12 months. Our strong shortlist of EitC 2024 award nominees included, Mary Day for outstanding efforts in making available, maintaining and controlling books for a well-read Village. Samantha Perry, for her contribution to a significant number of regular Parish wide events, and Tony Hurrell, for his major contribution to Village Safety. Well done to all! Samantha Perry was confirmed as the EitC award winner by the selection panel, including Cllrs Ed Hicklin, Mike Selby, and previous EitC award winners Richard Coates and Carole Bagnall. Sam receives a certificate of achievement, and her name is to be added to the EitC honours' board in the War Memorial Hall.

Mobile Phone Mast Installation: The mobile phone mast planning application and the terms of engagement have been approved. We await the lease agreement ahead of the mast installation process. The PC anticipates the Installation to be completed later this year.

**Village Traffic Congestion:** Thank you to everyone who provided feedback to the early indications of traffic alleviation in the village centre. This has been consolidated, and shared with DCC Highways. Further options are under consideration with the DCC Highways team. Details will emerge in due course ahead of a consultation process.

Road Conditions and Pot Holes: We all continue to see and witness increasing holes in our roads. We continue to report them, with open cases for Chellaston Lane, Derby Road and Weston Road to be repaired and fulfilled. Equally, anyone can report them via the website, or via the PC.

Village Health & Safety Report: The PC conducted its' village walk around our shared facilities and agreed a schedule of priorities to remove health & safety issues within the next 3 months, resolving to undertake any improvement issues over the next 6 months. Vigilance is key, please help us by reporting sightings of other risks and issues to the Clerk.

Long Walk Woods: Safety works are complete and the woods have reopened. The relentless wet weather has meant that the main pathways are waterlogged - please do your best to avoid creating new ones as these badly erode the woodland. SAVE is working with Richmond and Glendale on the Woodland Management Plan and alongside Weston Parish Council to ensure that necessary remedial work is completed. East Midlands Airport: Following July's consultation, the Noise Action Plan does address training flights but is disappointing overall, as it contains little in the way of clear targets to reduce noise. We have also heard that the Future Airspace Strategy is likely to increase flight paths and route much more air traffic near Aston and Weston. Many of our residents see EMA as a good neighbour, but we can't afford to be complacent. The flight volumes we see today are a small percentage of what's to come and we've already seen EMA back-pedalling on their own proposals to reduce timings and overflying from training flights. History Group If you go down to the woods today... You won't find a teddy bear but a new History Interpretive Panel! Located at the top of the track to Weston Grange, just across the road from the Recreation Centre. The panel explains the history of the Bronze-Age burial mound and the Cursus, that runs across that field, through the burial mound and into Shardlow where it disappears. I could explain what a Cursus is but why not have a spring walk and discover its origins for yourselves? It is the oldest recorded site in the village, with only 80 in the whole of the UK. The History Group has also been invited to take part in a medieval graffiti survey, being organised via the Trent Valley Archaeological Project. This is not your usual Odelgarde luvs Cathasach type of graffiti, but a survey in churches to discover more religious based marks, often related to protection against the devil. This is a project in which we may be able to engage the community as detectives and scour the walls for faded inscriptions. It promises to be quite exciting! We retain our usual invitations to listen to our monthly speakers in the War Memorial Hall every fourth Tuesday, with topics in the coming months ranging from local honey, the life of Churchill and Bonnie Prince Charlie at Swarkeston. ## **Friends of Aston Brickyard** (FAB)

The wet weather has had an impact on the work we've been able to do over the winter. We've felled a few trees, created new open glades to increase diversity, created some *live* hedging along the trail paths and planted around 50 young saplings. At present, the bluebells are emerging, birdsong is getting louder, frog spawn is turning into tadpoles and the whole site is getting greener by the day. In front of the mine exhibition, you'll spot two new planters beautifully created from two redundant cable drums. These have been fashioned by Jude, a Scout with the Trent Explorers, who rose to the challenge as part of a conservation award. Look closely and you'll see just how much work has gone into producing these two planters. The Nature Reserve has benefited from his imaginative approach and we're delighted that Jude also gained his award. The last few months has seen FAB engaged in a huge community project to provide 100 self-assembly bird box nesting kits for groups, families and organisations in the village. The idea being to install boxes in the nature reserve, homes and community spaces and provide the opportunity for individuals of all ages to gain skills in assembling them. To date, Richmond residents, the Scout Group, Parish Council, Church, Aston School, Bowls Club, Archery Club and FAB supporters have all been given box kits to make and install. Around 50 have already been distributed and we expect to give out the rest soon. We have other similar projects in mind; details to follow. AGM: We acknowledge that this is long overdue. We have set a date for this **21st May from 7.30pm** at the Recreation Centre. The main item for discussion will be addressing the long term future of the Watch scheme here in Aston. If you have an interest in the scheme continuing, or suggestions as to how we could innovate to secure our future, you would be very welcome.

**Committee:** We have not received any enquiries to help out on the committee, but most of our co-ordinators remain in place so the Watch remains structurally sound. Currently a team of four committee members looks likely to reduce further when two more will retire in May, thereby leaving two, which is not sustainable. Your help is needed please.

Membership: Our membership is always open. The formal renewal process runs every two years and your ongoing support is appreciated. Membership costs £2 for the two years. Thanks to all the co-ordinators who give their time to ensure the process works well. If you are not a member and would like to be, please contact us and we will put you in touch with your local co-ordinator.

### **Incidents:**

- A number of *House Burglaries* where the offender, a single male, enters premises in the late afternoon, having established residents were out. Entry commonly occuring through the rear of the property and across open ground has been reported.

- Cold callers aggressively selling roof moss cleaning services. Four complaints have been reported.

- Motorised Scooters. Some have been spotted around the village. Please remember these are classified as motor vehicles and currently cannot legally be ridden unless on private land and with the landowners permission, or a part as an authorised government scheme.

Co-ordinators: We still have some vacancies for Watch co-ordinators. The role is not onerous. Could you help? You would need to pass on our messages to your neighbours, most easily done via a secure, group email and collect subscription every two years. If you are interested in becoming more involved as a co-ordinator that would be very welcome, as some existing co-ordinators have large areas or are supporting households away from their own, close neighbours.

Lych Gate: After a number of peaceful years it appears that youngsters are once again finding the lych gate area a good place to congregate later in the evening; from 9pm or later. Recently, late night, loud music, shouting (and on one occasion) vomit, left for the Church Warden to clear up! If you know who they are, please have a word and if necessary report to the *Beat Team* at Melbourne.

Watch Communication: If you have reason to contact the Police please don't presume that contacting the Police means they will tell us, or keep us updated. Please let your co-ordinator know if you want to involve the *Watch* and seek help from residents. We do not take our information directly from social media, the information is rarely reliable enough for us to publish. We do always act whenever a co-ordinator passes a message which has come directly from a victim and where that victim has agreed for us to circulate the information.


